The ceremony which was held at the Limerick Enterprise Development Park (LEDP, Roxboro) was attended by the Mayor of Limerick, Councillor Ger Fahy and a considerable number of public representatives and other distinguished guests.

Piobaireachd

The most literal translation of piobaireachd is "pipering", or perhaps "what pipers do". Nowadays, it is normally taken to refer to the classical form of bagpipe music, developed by the McCrimmons in the 17th century. If you intend to compete in piobraireachd there are some of the most difficult movements in piping to contend with and their execution must be if not flawless then at least expressed in sympathy with both the 'theme' of the tune and the tempo you play it.

There followed an intensive programme over the next eighteen months to equip and train the band.

Limerick St. Patrick's Day parade of 1963 and since then has only missed three St. Patrick's Day parades in its native city. On two occasions the band represented the city in the New York parade and once in the city of Cork parade.
